



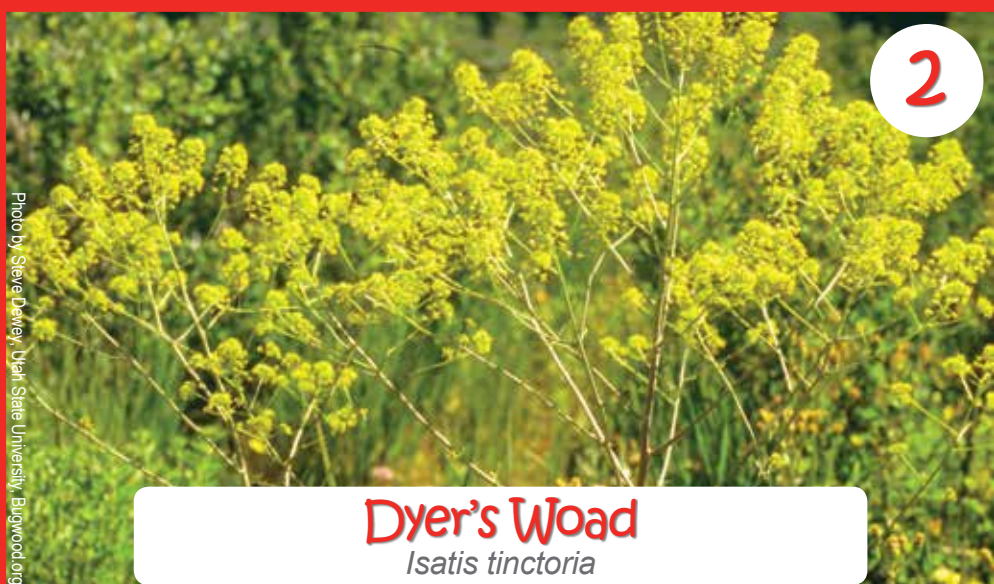
Montana Noxious Weed Education

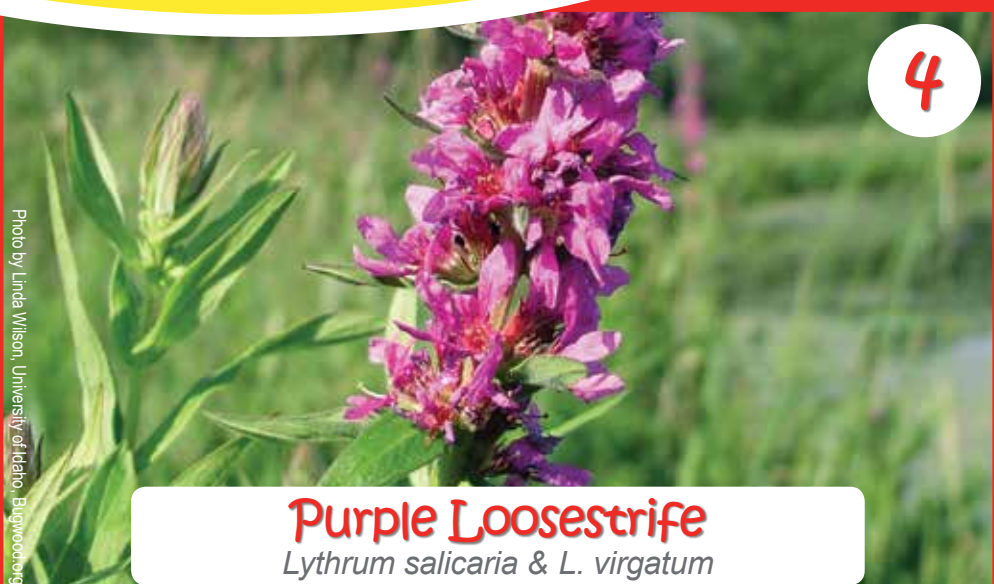

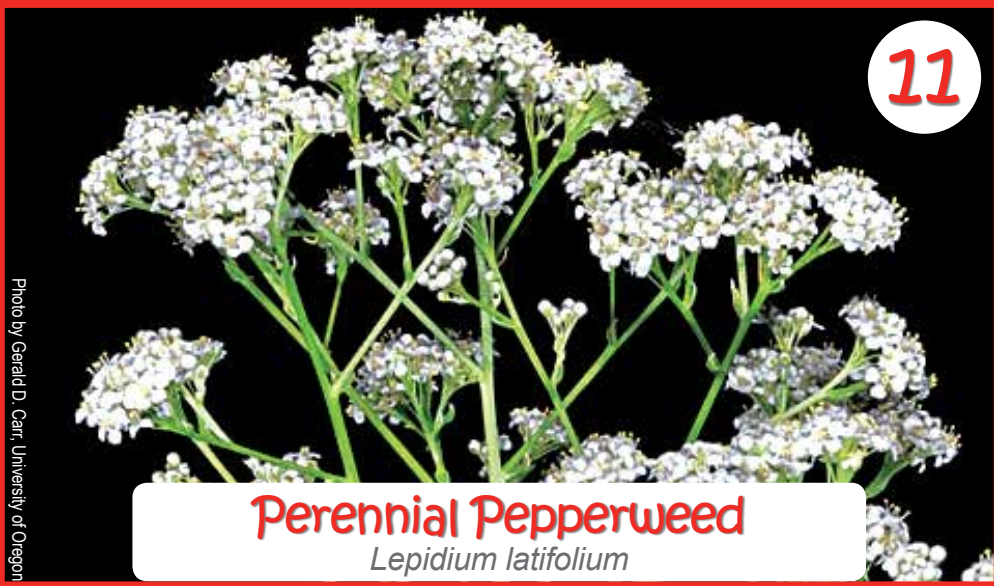
